RESPECTIVE FUNCTIONS OF THE BOARD OF GOVERNORS AND PRINCIPAL IN RELATION TO ADMISSIONS

The Board of Governors has drawn up the school's admissions criteria and has delegated to the Principal its function and responsibility in relation to the application of criteria, and the admission of pupils to the school.

- Priority will be given to children who will have attained compulsory school age at the time of their proposed admission, including those children whose parents deferred their admission to primary school in September 2022 as defined by the new School Age (NI) Act (both groups to be treated equally).
- Priority will be given to children resident in Northern Ireland at the time of their proposed admission to the school before those who are not so resident.

ADMISSIONS CRITERIA - YEAR 1

During the admissions procedure when applying the criteria <u>punctual applications</u> will be considered before <u>late applications</u> are considered. The application procedure opens on 10 January 2023 at 12noon (GMT) and an application submitted by the closing date of 27 January 2023 at 12noon (GMT) will be treated as a <u>punctual application</u>. An application received after 12noon (GMT) on 27 January 2023 and up to 4 pm on 31 January 2023 will be treated as a <u>late application</u>, this is also the last date and time for processing a change of preference in <u>exceptional circumstances</u>. After 4 pm on 31 January 2023 no applications will be processed until after the close of procedure on 27 April 2023.

The Board of Governors, has determined that the following Admissions Criteria will be applied in the order set down, to children of compulsory school age, only in the event of over-subscription. Priority will be given, in the application of each criterion to pupils, regarded by the Board of Governors, on the basis of supporting evidence from parents/guardians and/or Statutory agencies, as having special circumstances, (ie educational, medical, social, security). Children normally resident in Northern Ireland at the time of admission will be selected for admission before any child not resident in Northern Ireland.

- 1 Children whose normal place of residence is within the traditional intake areas St Mary's Parish and of Bligh's Lane.
- 2 Children who have brothers/sisters, half-brothers/sisters presently attending St John's.
- **3** Children who are the eldest child.
- 4 Children who are 'Looked After Children'.
- **5** All other children who apply.

Should any of these criteria result in over-subscription then the children will be selected for admission on the basis of initial letter(s) of surname (as entered on Birth Certificate) in the order set out below:

Mc A E I O R T W D H J P S Z B G L Q V C F K M N U Y X

It is the responsibility of the parents/guardians to ensure that all relevant information is given to the school to enable the Governors to apply the criteria.

When considering which children should be selected for admission, the Board of Governors will only take into account information which is detailed on the application or provided directly to the school. Parents/guardians should therefore ensure that all information pertaining to their child and relevant to the school's admissions criteria is stated on the application or provided directly to the school.

YEAR 1 ADMISSIONS – AFTER THE BEGINNING OF THE SCHOOL YEAR

The above criteria will apply if the number of late applications is greater than the number of places available.

DUTY TO VERIFY

The Board of Governors reserves the right to require such supplementary evidence as it may determine to support or verify information on any application form.

If the requested evidence is not provided to the Board of Governors by the deadline given, this will result in the withdrawal of an offer of a place. Similarly, if information is supplied which appears to be false or misleading in any material way, the offer of a place will be withdrawn.

WAITING LIST

The school does not operate a Waiting List Policy.

ADMISSIONS CRITERIA – YEARS 2-7

A pupil will be considered for enrolment provided that:

- 1 The school will not exceed its enrolment number as determined by the Department of Education.
- 2 This will not compromise the maximum class size recommended by the Department of Education.
- In the opinion of the Board of Governors this would not prejudice the provision of efficient education or the efficient use of resources in the school.
- 4 Having considered the needs of the pupil seeking entry to the school, the Board of Governors considers it is in the best interest of the pupil and of the school, to transfer.
